## Fixed issues

Users were unable to authenticate to endpoints when incorrect Kerberos TGS tokens were sent to the IDP server. (FIRST-17590, GD-55252)

# BlackBerry Access for iOS version 3.3.0.1363

This release of BlackBerry Access for iOS features the following enhancements:

- **iOS 15:** BlackBerry Access is compatible with iOS 15 and iPadOS 15.
- **Using saved credentials:** A new app configuration setting allows you to enforce the use of biometric authentication such as Face ID before allowing the user to reuse their saved credentials. If you want your users to use this feature, you must select the “Enable biometric authentication while reusing saved credentials” option in the app configuration for BlackBerry Access.
- **Manage content filter rules:** You can turn off MDM content filter rules that are configured for Safari in BlackBerry Access. If you want your users to use this feature, you must clear the “Allow MDM web content restrictions” option in the app configuration for BlackBerry Access.
- **Reorder bookmarks:** Users can now reorder bookmarks that they’ve added. This applies only to user added bookmarks, not corporate or home page.
- **Desktop view:** BlackBerry Access launches URLs in desktop view by default for iPad devices.
- **Presentation view:** You can allow web apps to open in presentation view. If you want your users to use this feature, you must select the “Allow other applications to open URLs in full screen mode” option in the app configuration for BlackBerry Access.
- **User tabs are saved:** Now when a user closes and then later reopens BlackBerry Access, information from their last session, such as open browser tabs, is loaded.
- **Autofill of credentials:** The new “Allow to save web form credentials and credentials autofill” option in the BlackBerry Access app configuration allows users to automatically fill in fields with saved passwords and credentials. BlackBerry Access for iOS supports password autofill for form-based, NTLM, Basic, Digest and Kerberos authentication types. Passwords on BlackBerry Access for iOS are not populated automatically. Users are prompted to autofill passwords using the new password manager after they authenticate using their container password.
- **Clear credentials on log out:** Web developers can use the new JavaScript API to clear credential storage when a user logs out of their account on a web page. If you are using the API, when you select the “Allow JavaScript to clear credentials” option in the BlackBerry Access app configuration, you then specify which domains or hosts the policy should apply to. You can add up to 10 domains. When you enable this feature, users will be prompted for credentials during subsequent logins.
- **Allow WebRTC:** You can now use a setting in the app configuration to turn the use of WebRTC off and on, which had been allowed by default in BlackBerry Access previously. Enabling WebRTC provides microphone and camera support required by services such as Zoom and WebEx. Note that Microsoft Teams and Slack are not supported for the mobile browser and only works on iPad devices in Desktop mode. When the setting is enabled, the user is prompted to approve the use of the camera and microphone when opening a supported site. If you want your users to use this feature, you must select the “Allow WebRTC” option in the app configuration for BlackBerry Access. WebRTC traffic is not routed through the BlackBerry Dynamics secure tunnel regardless of the network connectivity profile settings. WebRTC traffic goes direct to the internet. Also, Connectivity profile settings do not apply to WebRTC traffic.

## Fixed issues

BlackBerry Access opened the wrong telephone number when users tapped a Tel link the first time. (FIRST-17701)

BlackBerry Access didn't open the whiteboard from a URL. (FIRST-17666)

BlackBerry Access displayed a blank page when users opened a web page the second time. (FIRST-17706)

## Known issues

There are no known issues in this release.

## Known limitations

Users aren't prompted with the option to save passwords in the Password Manager for some web pages and on some devices. (GMAGDIOS-15131)

It is recommended that your organization updates websites with the latest HTML standards.

In environments configured with MDM content filter rules, users running an iOS version earlier than 13.4 are unable to access domains although the policy "Allow MDM web content restrictions (iOS Only)" is disabled. (GMAGDIOS-15097)

Cookies and other data may not be restored properly if you upgrade to BlackBerry Access version 3.2.1.1349 from version 3.2.0.1348 when it has stopped responding. (GMAGDIOS-14975)

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
