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BlackBerry Work for Android version 3.2.0.1512

This release of BlackBerry Work for Android features the following enhancements:

- **Disable out-of-office message:** Administrators can use a policy rule to disable users from setting an out-of-office email message in BlackBerry Work.
- **S/MIME encrypted messages (Beta feature):** When users send S/MIME encrypted messages to distribution lists, BlackBerry Work will retrieve certificates from BEMS and then from Microsoft Exchange. If BlackBerry Work cannot find certificates for some of the recipients in the distribution list, a list of those recipients displays, and the user can remove them from the list and send the email message to the remaining recipients. Users can send S/MIME email messages to public distribution lists that contain a maximum of 100 email addresses. BEMS 3.1 is required to support this feature.
- **Mailbox migration:** Administrators can migrate a user's email mailbox from a local Microsoft Active Directory to Office 365. While the migration is taking place, a message displays to let the user know that the migration is occurring. Migration from systems that use different authentication methods is supported. For example, migration from Exchange 2010 using Basic Authentication to Office 365 using Modern Authentication/ADAL.
- **Add watermarks to BlackBerry Dynamics-enabled apps screens:** Administrators can protect against data leakage by implementing an app policy that adds a watermark to the BlackBerry Dynamics-enabled apps (for example, BlackBerry Work, BlackBerry Work Docs, Contact, and Calendar). The watermark includes the username and the current date and time. This feature requires BlackBerry Work 3.2 or later that is running BlackBerry Dynamics SDK version 8.0 or later.
- **View certificate details:** Users can tap on the "Signed by" field in a Signed/Encrypted email message to view the certificate details.
- **BlackBerry Persona:** BlackBerry Intelligent Security has been renamed to BlackBerry Persona in Settings.
- **EAS 16.1 support:** BlackBerry Work now supports Microsoft Exchange Active Sync 16.1.
- **Calendar improvements:** The following improvements were made to the calendar: notes text, html formatting, hyperlinks, embedded images, and conferencing links.
- **Attachment icon:** When a calendar event has an attachment, an attachment icon displays.
- **Push sync changes:** When a user has the sync frequency set to "Push sync", if Push sync is unavailable, Auto-sync will be temporarily turned on. Push sync will be automatically re-enabled when it is available.
- **Phone app permission:** During activation, the user can choose to Allow or Deny the BlackBerry Work app to manage phone calls. If the user selects "Allow", provisioning is completed with an entry in Outlook for a registered phone with a phone number and operator name. If the user selects "Deny", provisioning is completed but without a phone number and operator name for a registered phone in Outlook.
- **Offline folder enhancements:** BlackBerry Work Docs now supports marking folders for offline. When users add folders to or remove folders from offline, the files contained within the folders are added to and removed from offline, respectively. Administrators can designate files or folders to users' offline folder. For administrators to designate a file or folder offline, BEMS 3.0 or later is required.
- **Support for PAC when viewing html files:** BlackBerry Work Docs now supports viewing html files using PAC files.

Fixed issues

BlackBerry Work stopped responding when a user opened a Microsoft Word document that was formatted with a custom Microsoft Office theme. (FIRST-17326)

Some S/MIME-encrypted email messages could not be decrypted. (FIRST-17302)

When a user generated a diagnostics report, BlackBerry Work stopped responding during the Mobility server step. (FIRST-17270)

BlackBerry Work stopped responding when a user opened a Microsoft Word document from BlackBerry Edit. (FIRST-17203)

If a user added an image to a meeting request that is using rich text format in Microsoft Outlook, when a meeting invitee opened the meeting request in BlackBerry Work, the image did not display. (FIRST-17188)

BlackBerry Work might have unexpectedly prompted users for their credentials. (FIRST-17166)

BlackBerry Work might not have been able to display some Microsoft PowerPoint slides. (FIRST-17104)

When users selected multiple files to edit in BlackBerry Edit the files didn't open. (G3DOCS-7614)

Known issues

There are no new known issues in this release.

Known limitations

Users can send S/MIME email messages to public distribution lists that contain a maximum of 100 email addresses. (G3ANDROID-21977)

When a user opens an attachment, and copies text from the attachment, they cannot paste the text into a new email message. (G3ANDROID-21948)

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
